





Ages of the group range from high school to long-retired adults, all of whom enjoy the thrill of making music together. Concerts are performed for the community throughout the year and include a variety of musical styles. Joel Frisch has been a member of the percussion section of the Olney Concert Band since 2006 and an assistant conductor since 2013. He was thrilled to take over the position of Music Director as of the 2014 season.

Dr. Frisch has received degrees in music performance from the Peabody Institute of the Johns Hopkins University and Michigan State University where he studied percussion, and a certificate in music education from Towson University.

As a freelance percussionist and timpanist, Joel has performed regularly with orchestras and other ensembles throughout both Maryland and Michigan. Most notably, he served as the Principal Timpanist and Percussionist of the Daejeon Philharmonic Orchestra in Daejeon, South Korea where he performed all over the United States and Asia. Joel is currently a music educator in the Harford County Public School System as the head band director at C. Milton Wright High School in Bel Air. His responsibilities include overseeing the C. Milton Wright Drumline and directing the Percussion and Jazz Ensembles. He also teaches guitar and maintains a private percussion studio from which many of his students have qualified for All-County and All-State honors ensembles. Joel and wife, Dana, reside in Columbia, MD, with their son, Charlie, two cats, Miles and Ella; and a dog named Miss Bubbles.

Established in 1981, the **Baltimore Symphonic Band**, in residence at The Community College of Baltimore County Essex, utilizes the skills and talents of an all-volunteer membership to provide its audiences with the opportunity to hear quality band music ranging from marches to symphonic works. Musicians of all ages with a variety of musical backgrounds are provided with the opportunity to broaden and apply their musical performance skills. They participate in the band out of the love of playing and performing music.

The Band has performed all over the state of Maryland, including the Baltimore Inner Harbor Concert Series, the Bel Air Concert Series, the Perry Hall Concert Series, the Aberdeen Concert Series, the Havre de Grace Concert Series, Charlestown Retirement Community, Oak Crest Village, Riderwood Village, St. Joseph's Church and at The Music Forum at the Maryland Boychoir Center for the Arts. In 2008, 2005, and 1999, the band embarked on international tours which included Switzerland, Austria, Germany, Italy, Croatia, and Slovenia, where it performed several concerts.

Abhinn Malhotra, Conductor

Originally from Long Island, Abhinn began his undergraduate education at Hofstra University as a Euphonium Performance major studying with Michael Salzman. He was the recipient of the Stephen P. Saltzman Endowed Scholarship, an annual award for undergraduate Euphonium players demonstrating excellence in performance. During his time at Hofstra, he also began studying independently and performing as a soloist under the guidance of Aaron Vanderweele. Abhinn transferred to the Peabody Institute of Music to complete his undergraduate Euphonium studies with Dr. Steven Kellner. He has performed at Peabody as principal Euphonium of the Peabody Wind Ensemble, and Brass Band, and as a member of the Peabody Concert Orchestra, Tuba-Euphonium Ensemble, Brass Ensemble, and Trombone Ensemble. It was at the Peabody Institute that he also began formally studying Wind Conducting with Dr. Harlan D. Parker.

After graduating with his Bachelor's Degree in Euphonium Performance, Abhinn returned to Peabody and began pursuing two Master's degrees in Wind Conducting and Euphonium Performance, continuing his studies with Dr. Harlan D. Parker, and Dr. Steven Kellner respectively.

After completing his Graduate degrees in 2018, Abhinn returned to the Peabody Institute as a Doctoral Candidate in Wind Conducting, and was awarded the Wind

Conducting Graduate Assistantship. He teaches beginner conducting courses, assists with and advanced conducting courses taught by Dr. Harlan Parker, and continues to give recitals and conducts the Peabody Wind Ensemble along with his duties as the music director for the Johns Hopkins Wind Ensemble. Outside of music, Abhinn enjoys cooking, road trips, and is an avid hockey and baseball fan.

Columbia Concert Band 1:00 PM

Founded in 1983, the **Columbia Concert Band (CCB)** provides local musicians in Howard County, MD, and surrounding areas the opportunity to perform challenging band literature while entertaining the public in the Baltimore and Washington region. The band is also affiliated with Howard Community College, which gives credit to students for band participation. The Columbia Concert Band is a group of approximately 120 musicians (80-90 generally participate at any given time), under the direction of Michael Blackman. We rehearse weekly and perform about five concerts per year. Our repertoire consists of many different musical styles, including traditional band arrangements, classical, contemporary, pop/rock, marches, jazz, Broadway, and Americana. The Columbia Concert Band is part of Columbia Bands, Inc., a registered non-profit organization that also includes the Columbia Big Band and Flute Cocktail (a flute choir).

Director Michael Blackman

A soloist and performer in many sections of the Columbia Concert Band since 1986, Michael Blackman became the Assistant Conductor in 1995. In the fall of 2000, he took over as Director and has worked with the membership to heighten performance standards and increase support from within the community.

Mr. Blackman received a Bachelor of Science in Music Education from the University of Maryland, College Park. He studied clarinet with Ed Walters, performed under John Wakefield, and studied conducting with Dr. Paul Traver. He completed a Master's Degree in Music Education at the Peabody Conservatory of Music, studying conducting with Dr. Harlan Parker.

Mr. Blackman is a member of the National Music Honor Society Kappa Lambda, the International Professional Music Fraternity Mu Phi Epsilon, and the National Honorary Band Fraternity Kappa Kappa Psi. He has served on the Executive Board of the Maryland Band Directors' Association and has adjudicated and guest-conducted in various school districts in Maryland and Delaware.

A product of Howard County Public Schools, Michael eagerly accepted a position as an instrumental music teacher with the school system in 1991. He currently teaches Band and Music Theory students at River Hill High School and has performed with his Wind Ensemble at the prestigious "Music For All" National Festival in Indianapolis. He is a former director of the Howard County Elementary School Band, a select group of young instrumentalists who perform middle and high school level repertoire.

He was also a music arranger/instructor for the award-winning Atholton High School Marching Band, which was directed by his own former teacher, Mr. Lee Stevens.

Mr. Blackman lives in Columbia with his wife Kathie; daughter, Julianne; and twin sons, Collin and Justin.





Hunt Valley Wind Ensemble 2:00 PM

The **Hunt Valley Wind Ensemble (HVWE)**, was founded in 2016 by Jenn Ambrosiano, as a non-profit, all-volunteer organization which is sponsored by the Cockeysville Recreation Council in Baltimore County, Maryland. HVWE performs under the direction of Matthey T. Benner, a percussionist, and a music teacher in the Baltimore County Public Schools, and Assistant Conductor, Joshua Baker, high school band director of Harford County Public Schools. HVWE is made up of 65 musicians and has been growing steadily since the band's inception. The band's main repertoire includes grade 5 and some grade 4 and 6 pieces and they perform concerts throughout the year, including formal indoor concerts as well as outdoor concerts. There are no auditions and rehearsals are year-round on Monday evenings in Timonium, MD. The band is a member of the Association of Concert Bands (ACB).



Matthew Benner, Conductor

Matthew T. Benner is the Conductor of the Hunt Valley Wind Ensemble. Matthew holds a Bachelor's degree in Music from Millersville University and a Master's degree in Music Education from Towson University. Throughout his career, Matthew has worked with several bands, most recently the Towson University Concert Band. He is currently teaching instrumental music at Dulaney High School in Timonium, Maryland. Matthew currently resides in Baltimore with his wife (Elaine), daughter (Clara), son (Felix), and two dogs (Bianca and Nigel). In his (non-existent) spare time, he is an active curler, board game aficionado, and DCI (Drum Corps International) enthusiast.



Joshua Baker, Assistant Conductor

Joshua Baker holds a Bachelor's Degree in Music Education from the University of Delaware. He is currently the Instrumental Music Teacher at Joppatowne High School in Harford County, where he directs the concert, marching, and jazz band, as well as the orchestra. He also finds time to coach the boy's lacrosse team at Joppatowne as well. Joshua has performed in several community ensembles in Maryland and Delaware, and frequently performed on electric bass in pits for musical productions in the area. Joshua lives in Perry Hall with his partner Heather-Ryen, and his two cats,

Clyde and Abra. In his free time, he can usually be found napping, cooking, or playing board and tabletop games.



Jenn Ambrosiano, Founder & President

Jenn Ambrosiano is the founder and president of the Hunt Valley Wind Ensemble. Jenn started the organization in 2016, for the areas of Hunt Valley, Cockeysville, Timonium, and beyond, as a way to give back to the community through music. Jenn's primary instrument is the flute and she has been part of many local community music organizations around the state of Maryland, including other community bands and various flute choirs. Originally from Setauket, NY (Long Island), Jenn discovered playing in concert bands doesn't have to end with high school or college when she found a few local community groups to join post-college. In addition to her involvement with the band, Jenn also plays with other community music groups, serves on a number of non-profit boards, coaches field hockey, and mentors Girl Scouts as a troop leader. Jenn lives in Cockeysville with her husband and is a stay-athome mother to her three children





Rockville Concert Band 4:00 PM

The **Rockville Concert Band** was founded in 1957 by Frank R. Troy, Jr. He was the director until 1974. He was followed in 1957 by co-directors Steven and Carol Barnes. Dr. Robert Tennyson reigned from 1978 to September 1994, when he left to take a position in Austria. Dr. Vincent Patterson held the director's position from July 1995-to 2009. John Saint Armour let the band from 2010 until 2020. Dr. Juan Gallastegui was selected as the Associate Music Director in 2019 and appointed as Music Director in September 2020.

The Band is supported by the city of Rockville, Maryland, through the Department of Recreation and Parks. We have a current roster of approximately 75 members. The purpose of the band is "to provide for the community of Rockville, Maryland, a concert band and a recreational outlet for adult musicians."

All types of music are played by the band: classical transcriptions, original compositions for concert band, pops, Dixieland, marches, musicals, jazz, rock, patriotic, and novelties. Our concerts include holiday concerts, children's concerts, and animation concerts 3ith music from movies and television with an accompanying slide show.

The band performs about 10 concerts each year. About six concerts are played during the fall, winter, and spring seasons at the F. Scott Fitzgerald Auditorium, Rockville Civic Center. Our outdoor season includes concerts at the Memorial Day ceremonies for Rockville and at various locations throughout the county. The band has played at the Antique and Classic Car Show in October on the grounds of the Rockville Civic Center. We have played concerts at Wheaton and Cabin John Regional Parks; at the Maryland Community Band Day; at the Washington National Cathedral; on the Millenium Stage at the Kennedy Center; and at Rehoboth Beach and Bethany Beach, Delaware, to name a few. Two very memorable events for the band were European tours. The first in 1989, was a fifteen-day tour with concerts in Austria, Italy, Switzerland, and West Germany, including a tour and concert in Rockville's sister city Pinneberg (near Hamburg). The second, in 1994, was a seventeen-day tour with concerts in Switzerland, Austria, Italy, and the Czech Republic, and sightseeing in Germany and Hungary. Both of these European tours were wonderful opportunities to raise our level of musicianship, to become closer as a group, and to see the world.

The band has fostered two additional music ensembles: The Rockville Swing Band and the Rockville German Gand. These bands play concerts in venues where small er ensembles work better.

Juan Gallastegui - Music Director

Jean Gallastegui is the Music Director of the Rockville Concert Band (Rockville, MD), and Music Director of the DC Strings Orchestra (Washington DC). He is an ASCAP

He is also a member of the League of American Orchestras, the National Bands Association, the National Association of Concert Band, and the International Conductors Guild. Since 2016, Gallastegui has established a reputation in the Washington, D.C., Maryland, and Virginia area as a conductor and educator and he is in demand to work with community groups, semi-professional orchestras, and youth groups. An accomplished euphonium player, Gallastegui played in different wind bands in Spain for more than twenty years before moving to the United States where he began to study



Williamsport Community Band 5:00 PM

The Williamsport Community Band met for the first time during the summer of 1989. The practice was held on the gazebo at Byron Memorial Park in Williamsport, MD. There were about 30 musicians in attendance. None of the musicians were exactly sure what the band was going to sound like, but all of them were convinced that the adventure would be fun.

The mayor at the time, John Slayman, and long-time town resident, Nelson Deal, wanted this day to happen for a very long time. They had been on a mission for years to develop a "town band". They finally convinced Susie Kunkle, a Williamsport native and former director of the Williamsport High School Blue Band to give it a try.

From that summer day in the park in 1989, the band has grown in number and in quality of musicianship. The band boasts a membership of 60+ excellent musicians from all walks of life. Members come from the tri-state area, including Maryland, West Virginia, and Pennsylvania. All are volunteers and enjoy playing because of their love of music.

The band presents two indoor concerts per year in December and May. During the summer months, the band performs concerts in the Tri-State area. One of the most impressive concerts of the summer is held on July 4th with a huge celebration and fireworks celebrated by thousands of people. The event is held in Byron Memorial Park in Williamsport. The idea of this great celebration was generated by the band many years ago and has developed into an all-day affair.

From that first summer day in the gazebo to the present, the band has developed into an icon in Williamsport and the surrounding area. The band has developed from an idea to reality...a fun adventure to an excellent musical organization...and a respected representative of the town of Williamsport.

Mr. John Slick - Director

John Slick is in his sixth year as music director of the Williamsport Community Band. A native of Washington County, John is a 2008 graduate of Boonsboro High School and a 2013 graduate of Shenandoah University. At Shenandoah, he studied French Horn with William Zsembery and Joseph Lovinsky and conducting with Scott Nelson and Damon Talley. In addition to his work with the Williamsport Community Band, John spent 15 years on the staff of the Boonsboro High School band serving as the band's assistant director, drill designer, and music arranger. Currently, John works in

mental health counseling, obtaining his Master's Degree in Clinical Mental Health Counseling from Hood College in 2022. He lives in Hagerstown with his wife, Nicole, and son, Jackson.
